He was born May 12, 1915 in Hamtramck, MI to the late Jacob and Julia Ponczek, and graduated from Detroit Pershing High School in 1933. He served in the US Army Air Corps during WWII. 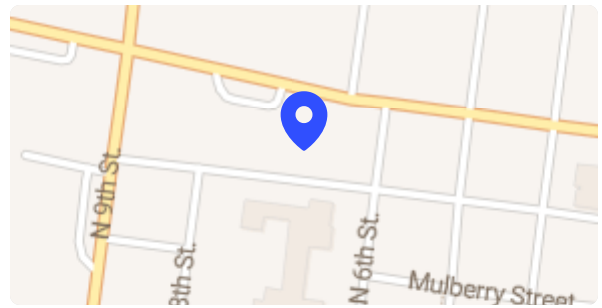
