Leighn "Lee" Munro, age 84, of St. Clair, passed away peacefully surrounded by his family on Sunday May 5 at Regency on the Lake, Fort Gratiot. He was born December 29, 1934 to the late Neil and Harriet Munro. Lee joined the United States Army in 1952 where he proudly served our country for 22 years, serving two tours in Korea and two tours in Vietnam. On August 17, 1957 he married Evon Charron. Lee enjoyed hunting, traveling, and spending time with his family, especially his great grandchildren. Lee proudly received the Bronze Star and Army Accommodation Medal with a V for Valor.

He is survived by his wife of 62 years, Evon; daughters, Kathy Leverenz and Connie Munro; grandchildren, Leighann (Nick) Nunnally, Michelle (John) Hollosy; great grandchildren, Alex Hicks, Aiden Roulo, Lucas, and Parker Nunnally

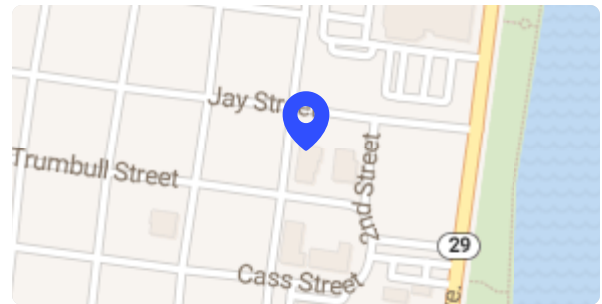

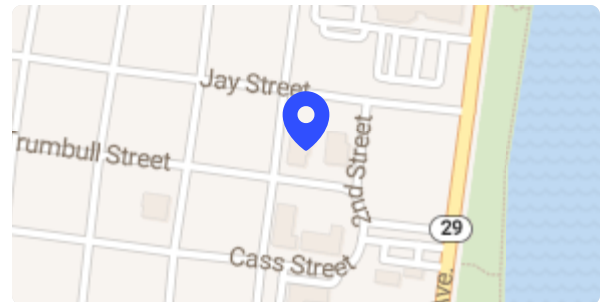

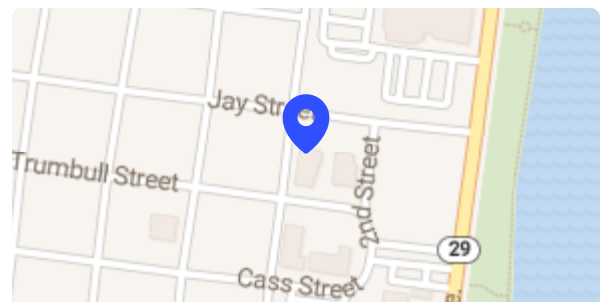
